Regional Groups are Organizing!

As a supplement to our regular quarterly meetings and Lunch N' Learns, MeASBO is supporting regional groups in an effort to help ensure that individual region professional development needs are met.

Regional programs are a work in progress; we are currently establishing regional team leaders. Regions are aligned with MDOE's "Superintendent Regions", generally reflecting county borders.

Opportunities for regional team leaders are currently available in Aroostook, Washington, Midcoast, Kennebec, Cumberland, and York regions. The role of a regional team leader includes:

- Consistent schedule of meetings, with dates/times/locations communicated to the region's MeASBO members
- 2) Coordination/scheduling of topic(s) to be discussed/presented at each meeting
- 3) Report of region meeting activity at quarterly MeASBO meeting (report may be done in person or by written submission to MeASBO Executive Director)
- 4) If requested, MeASBO can create a discussion forum via the MeASBO website for each region to be used to ask questions, share information, announce meetings, etc. The regional leader would be the moderator of the forum, with the MeASBO ED as back up.
- 5) Coordinate with MeASBO'a Executive Director to ensure accuracy of membership list
- 6) Periodically inform Professional Development Committee of any challenges/issues within region or regional model

School Transportation Updates

Happy October Maine ASBO Members!

As we ramp up the 2024-2025 School Year, I wanted to share some School Transportation related items with you that are important to your school's transportation operations.

In accordance with <u>Code of Maine Regulations (05–071) CMR Chapter 81</u> it is important that your transportation departments meet the training and reporting requirements set forth.

NEO Reporting

To ensure that you don't lose any of your approved School Bus Purchase Program (SBBP) funding for FY24, please be sure that your NEO Transportation Reports are completed <u>and certified by the Superintendent</u> by October 15, 2024.

EFT-21 - Transportation Safety & Training Report

EFT 24 - Transportation Vehicle Inventory Report

EFM-43 – Transportation Data Out-Of-District Special Education Students, Homeless Students and Career and Technical Education Students Report.

School Transportation Safety

Within Chapter 81, it is important to note that you must complete student and employee training annually. Remind your Transportation Department that Emergency Evacuation Drills & Safe Riding Practices Trainings must be completed once per semester, totaling two times per year. The district must keep records of the training and drills.

Employee Training is also a requirement and that is reported on in EFT-21. All School Transportation Employees must complete <u>16-Hours of training annually</u>. This also must be documented. Part of this training could be done by having your employees attend the MAPT Conferences detailed below.

School Bus Purchase Program Requests - FY26

The New Bus Requests (EFT-17) is open annually from November 1 – 25. This past year, many districts did not complete their requests within the window and ended up in the secondary "Round 2" approvals for funding. As a reminder, if your district applies for SBBP Funding, is approved, and then decides not to move forward with a bus purchase, it is important to <u>withdraw</u> your funding request in NEO as soon as possible to allow the state to reallocate those funds to a district that ended up on the waitlist for funding.

Maine Association for Pupil Transportation (MAPT)

The <u>Maine Association for Pupil Transportation</u> is made up of school districts, school bus contractors and industry vendors. It supports the safe transportation of school-aged students across Maine. One of the many things that the association does for its members is host annual regional and statewide training opportunities. These educational workshops and skills competitions are a great way to keep your transportation staff up to date on the latest safety topics and trends in school transportation and that they are keeping their skills sharp.

Six regional conferences are held annually. Four conferences are held during April Spring Break and two are held in the last week of June for The County & Down East areas. There is also a statewide Safety Conference & Trade Show that will be held at the Augusta Civic Center from July 16-18, 2025, that brings in hundreds of transportation professionals from around the state with great local, regional and national speakers and vendors for all areas of the school transportation industry. More information on these will be sent out from the association by the end of the calendar year. I would strongly encourage your districts to take advantage of these great training opportunities.

2024 EPA Clean School Bus Program - October 2024

On March 29, 2024, the EPA announced the Final Rule of the <u>Greenhouse Gas Emissions Standards for Heavy Duty Vehicles – Phase 3</u> (GHG-3) which will implement lower NOx standards, Clean Idle regulations & Regulatory (extended) Warranties. This will impact the cost of your diesel school buses. The US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is expected to release the next round of <u>Clean School Bus Program Funding</u> this month (if they haven't already by the time this newsletter is published). This program continues to provide funding to school districts to purchase Low and Zero Emission School Buses for their fleets.

Many schools in Maine have already taken advantage of previous funding opportunities in this program and some were recently awarded funding as part of the 2023 Rebate round. I would encourage school leaders, like yourselves, to look at opportunities within your districts where Zero-Emission School Buses would work and apply for funding to support pilot projects. I have always said that every school district has at least one route that an electric school bus could run on. DeVivo Bus Sales is willing to work with your districts on their applications so please reach out to us! We have an EV Project Manager, Andy

EPS Reporting Deadlines

The three major data sets to be used in the calculation of FY 2025-2026 state subsidy, 2024-2025 staff, October 1, 2024 student counts, and FY 2023-2024 actual expenditure and revenue, are due to be reported to MDOE *no later than November 15*. In the case of your actual expenditure and revenue uploads to MEFS, those files must be in migrated status in order for MDOE to access the data. Migrated status means that the files are error free to enable MDOE to approve the files; once MDOE approves, you must "sign off" on the file. This timeline is extremely important in order to ensure the accurate calculation of your school unit's FY 2025-2026 state subsidy. 
